History of the Institution

Baratiya Vidya Bhavan is a Registered society and a Charitable Trust founded in 1938 by **Dr K M Munshi**, a far-sighted visionary and a practical idealist, along with three of his close associates with the blessings of Mahatama Gandhi to preserve and propagate Sanskrit, the mother of languages. It had the priviledge of association of distinguished Freedom fighters and leaders of pre-independence and post-independence India such as Dr Rajendra Prasad, the first President of India, Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of India, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the first Home Minister of India, Shri C Rajagopalachari and others.



5.5 If the yearly rent hereby reserved or any part thereof shall at any time be in arrear and unpaid for one, calender month next after any of the said days whereon the same shall have become due, whether the same shall have been demanded or not, or if there shall have been in the opinion of the tessor been demanded or not, or if there shall have been in the opinion of the Lessor or the Chief Commissioner of Delhi whose decision shall be final, any break by the Lessee or by any person claiming through or under him of any of the covenants or conditions hereinbefore contained except those contained in sub-clauses (5), (9) and (10) of Clause 2 and on his part to be observed or performed or if it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Lessor or the Chief Commissioner of Delhi whose decision shall be final that the said activities or that the Bhavan building is improperly or is improperly or

I am directed to convey the sanction of the President to the allotment of a plot of land about one acre on Curzon Road opposite the Constitution Club, to the Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, on payment of premium at the rate of No. 5,000/- per acre, with an annual ground rent of 5% thereon, for constructing a building to carry on the Bhavan's cultural activities. The allotment is subject to the following conditions:-

- (i) The Bhavan shall be at liberty to use the halls, rooms and theatre for its activities in persuance of its objectives, if necessary, by charging fees from the audience for admission, provided exemption from the levy of the State Entertainment Tax is simultaneously secured on each such occasion when an admission fee is proposed to be charged, and whenever the halls, rooms or theatre are not required by the Bhavan, the Bhavan shall be at liberty to charge for their use by other parties, provided that such use small be confined only to clubs, societies or educational or charitable associations or artiste association and societies, and in case of entertainments only when the hirers have secured exemption from the levy of State Entertainment Tax if the hirers propose to levy an admission fee on the audience; the permission should, in no case, be let out to any professional, theatrical or cinematograph company or other professional entertainer, unless the purpose of such letting has been approved by the Chief Commissioner.
- (ii) The Bhavan shall be at liberty to conduct a restaurant or cafeteria on the premises and recover catering charges from those making use of the restaurant or cafeteria, provided that such restaurant or cafetaria shall be run principally for the benefit of persons living or working on the premises or attending a function held therein, and it shall not be allowed to develop as a general restaurant for the public;
- (iii) The Bhavan shall be at liberty to construct rooms in the building which may be let out to temporary use of members of the Bhavan for residential purposes provided that such residents are not permitted to set up any kitchen arrangements independent of the Bhavan's restaurant or cafteria;
 - (iv) Certain portions of the building, as agreed to by the Chief Commissioner prior to construction, may be reserved for the residence of the caretaker and resident officers whose presence on the premises is accepted as necessary by the Chief Commissioner and
 - (V) No musical performance shall be permitted after 11 p.m.

The Bhavan should complete the proposed buildings on the site within 2 years from the date of allotment of the site.


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
APPROVED BUILDING PLAN
