GUIDELINES FOR PAPER AND POSTER PRESENTATIONS

- 1. All submissions must be made in Word format.
- 2. The manuscript should be between 3500 to 5000 words, typed in double space.
- 3. The cover page should bear only the title of the paper, name/s of the author/s, their official address, E-mail ID, phone numbers, a brief biographical note of the author/s.
- 4. The first page of the manuscript (after the cover page) should contain the title and Abstract only.
- 5. Font Type-Times New Roman, Size-12
- 6. Referencing should be as per the latest APA style.

Guidelines for the Abstract

- 1. The abstract should not exceed 400 words.
- 2. The contributors should kindly provide their name/s, mailing address, E-mail and phone along with the abstract.

Guidelines for Poster Presentation

- 1. Poster should be of the size of cartridge sheet.
- 2. Text included in the poster should be large and legible.
