Seminar on “From Sanskaar to Sankalp: Indian Knowledge for Building a Resilient National Character”

A Seminar on the topic “*From Sanskaar to Sankalp: Indian Knowledge for Building a Resilient National Character*” was organised on September 1st, 2025 by Bhavan’s Leelawati Munshi College of Education (BLMCE) in collaboration with Guru Ram Dass College of Education in Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, Delhi Kendra. The seminar commenced with the lamp lighting and a Sarvadharmha Prayer symbolizing unity and harmony, followed by a welcome address by Dr Geetika Dutta, Dean (Academics) Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, Delhi Kendra. The event was carried forward by address of Dr. Arti Bhatnagar, who emphasized the role of Indian values in nation-building. Afterwards, Prof. Saroj Sharma, an eminent teacher educator elaborated on incorporating indigenous knowledge traditions into modern pedagogy, urging educators to revisit India’s cultural heritage in curriculum design. Next, Dr. Neeraj Priya explained the journey from Sanskaar (values) to Sankalp (determination), highlighting how early value-based learning shapes responsible citizens.

Dr. C.K.Saluja connected the essence of Sarva dharmha Prarthana and the teachings of the Vedas to present-day education, showing their timeless relevance for intellectual, moral, and spiritual development. The session was thought provoking and linked traditional Indian philosophies with contemporary education. The event concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Shalini Gupta, HOD, B.Ed. Department, who summarized the key learnings. Overall, the seminar was successful in creating awareness of how cultural values and indigenous wisdom can be harnessed to build a strong, future-ready generation of educators and students.



Seminar on “Dharma, Dhyana, and the Discovery of Self”

“Dharma, Dhyana, and the Discovery of Self” a highly enlightening seminar was organized on 10th October, 2025, at Munshi Memorial Hall, Mittal Sadan. The seminar brought together eminent scholars who shared their insights on ancient wisdom, yoga, positive psychology, and self-realization, highlighting the relevance of these teachings

in contemporary life. Shri. K. Siva Prasad, Retd. IAS and Director, Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, Delhi Kendra emphasized the importance of self-regulation and





detachment (Vairagya) for achieving mental stability and well-being. Dr. Arpit Kumar Dubey, Assistant Professor at the Morarji

Desai National Institute of Yoga, explained yoga as a holistic path for self-realization. He stressed that all our actions should be mutually beneficial, supporting both Atmakalyan (self-welfare) & Lok Kalyan (social welfare). Prof. Girishwar Misra, Ex-Vice Chancellor of Mahatma Gandhi Antarashtriya Hindi Vishwavidyalaya, Wardha, focused on understanding and managing the mind (Mana) through ancient wisdom and ethical living. Quoting the Yajurveda and Shiva Sankalpa Suktam, he highlighted the importance of Dharma, explaining that actions must ultimately benefit others. Prof. Girishwar Misra emphasized that understanding our relational responsibilities and empathizing with others promote emotional intelligence and strengthen psychological health. Sir highlighted that body, mind, and spirit are interdependent; nourishing the body through good habits, the mind through positive thoughts, and the spirit through ethical living and meditation ensures complete health.

Seminar on Glimpses of Different Childhood in India

On 10 October, 2025, a seminar on Glimpses of Different Childhoods in India was conducted in MPH under the guidance of B.Ed faculty, where all tutorial groups presented the diverse realities of childhood across the country. Each group highlighted different themes such as rural and urban childhoods, migrant and refugee children, marginalized communities, child labour, children with special needs, first-generation learners, and those without traditional families. The presentations focused on the challenges faced by these children and the role of teachers in ensuring inclusion, equity, and holistic development. The seminar helped all to comprehend how socio-economic, cultural, and familial factors influence children's learning. It reinforced the need for sensitive, flexible, and learner-centred teaching practices.



Seminar on Iconic Figures



Bhavan's Leelawati Munshi College of Education organized a students' Seminar Presentation on the theme "Celebration of Life and Work of Iconic Figures" on 24th October 2025. The event aimed to enrich cultural understanding and promote reflective learning among B.Ed student-teachers. The seminar was conducted in two slots under the guidance of Dr. Gayathri S, Dr. Indu Dahiya, Dr. Nisha Mishra, and Dr. Preeti Sharma. Tutorial groups presented the life journeys and contributions of eminent personalities such as Meerabai, Narayan Guru, Habib Tanvir, Begum Akhtar, Saadat Hasan Manto, Veer Savarkar, Rabindranath Tagore, and Kabir. Using multimedia, dramatization, and storytelling, each group delivered 10–15minutes engaging presentations. The seminar fostered creativity, teamwork, cultural awareness, and empathy. It concluded with appreciation for the efforts of all groups and served as an inspiring reminder of how iconic figures continue to guide future educators.

Session on Financial Planning

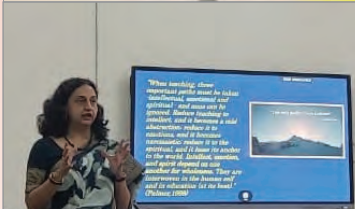
A session on Financial Planning was held on 19th September, 2025 in the MMH Hall to spread awareness about money management and smart investments. The session began with engaging videos that highlighted the sequence of income → Savings → Expenses, emphasising the principle of "put saving first". The resource person then outlined the essential steps in financial planning and introduced students to the smart framework-Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, and Timely- as a practical tool for achieving financial goals. An interactive session encouraged students to share their views and clarify doubts.

Participants also learned about Mutual Funds and Systematic Investment Plans (SIP) as effective tools for disciplined investing. To enhance investor literacy, details about the SEBI Investor Awareness Test were shared, along with demonstrations of the Saarthi App for education and SCORES 2.0, an online grievance and redress platform. The session concluded with practical tips, leaving students motivated to adopt sound financial planning habits.



WORKSHOPS

Workshop on Mindfulness



As part of the B.Ed. curriculum, a two-day Mindfulness Workshop was held on 16 and 24 October from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. in the Multi Purpose Hall, led by Dr. Geetika Dutta, Dean (Academics), Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, Delhi Kendra. Designed to introduce student-teachers to mindfulness as a practical, evidence-based skill, the workshop wove together reflective dialogue and experiential practice to illuminate how sustained awareness, emotional equilibrium, and present moment attention enrich both teaching and personal well being. Dr. Dutta began the session by distinguishing between being “mindfull” and being “mindful,” inviting participants to notice how habitual thoughts and worries obscure the immediacy of experience; she framed mindfulness as non-judgmental awareness of one’s thoughts, feelings, and actions. Through a guided discussion on “What is mindfulness?” students reframed an abstract idea into a usable classroom tool that cultivates clarity, calm, compassion, patience, and focused attention. Practical exercises—mindful breathing, deep listening without interruption and techniques for catering and grounding—helped participants recognize how rarely they truly listen and how simple practices can deepen communication and emotional understanding. The workshop concluded as an enriching, transformative experience that encouraged student and teachers to slow down, reflect, and reconnect amid daily pressures, demonstrating that small, consistent practices can restore balance, sharpen purpose, and nurture the mind, body, and spirit essential to authentic education.

SPECIAL LECTURES

Guest Lecture on “Role of Teacher Educators after the Implementation of NEP 2020” by Dr. Nahar Singh



Bhavan’s Leelawati Munshi College of Education organized an enlightening lecture on the topic “Role of Teacher Educators after the Implementation of NEP 2020.” The session was delivered by Dr. Nahar Singh, Joint Director, SCERT. Waste Segregation Drive

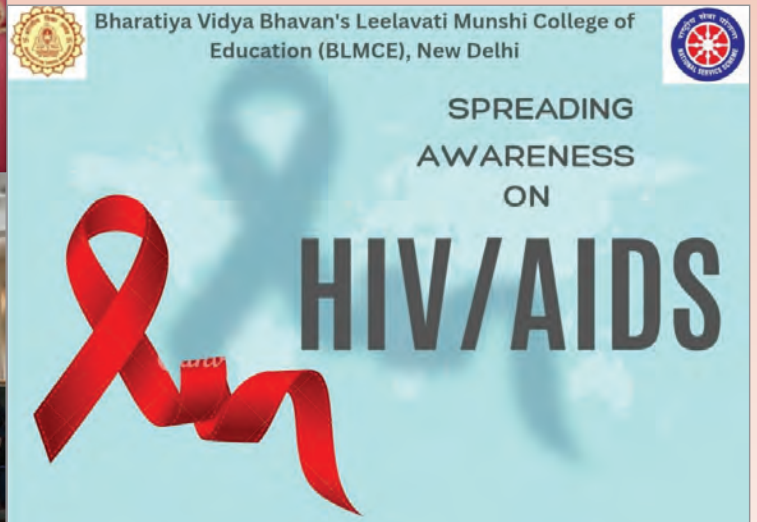

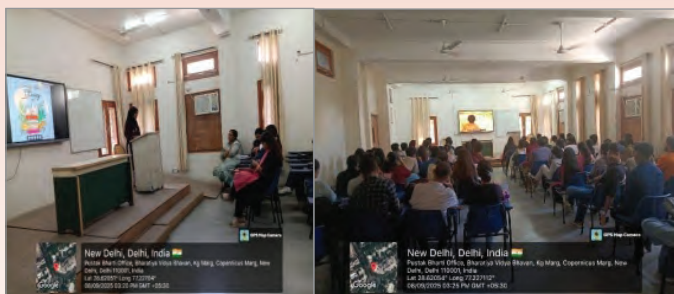

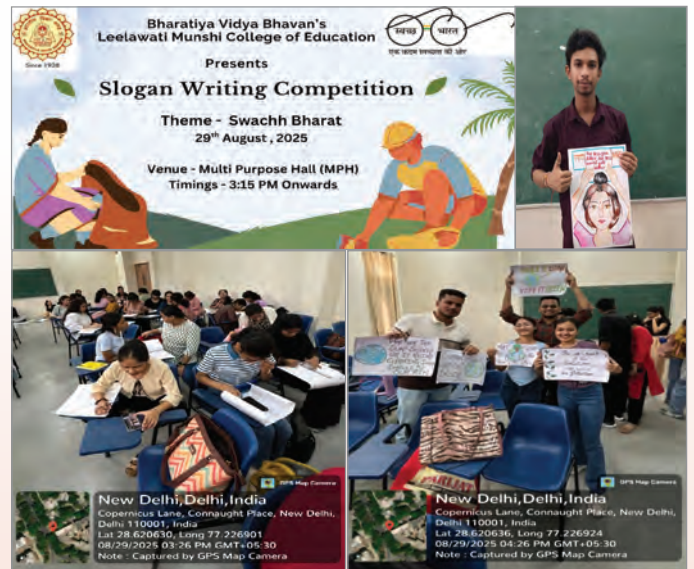
who emphasized the profound role of teachers in character building, value education, and holistic development, reminding all present that education is not merely the transmission of knowledge but the shaping of lives.



COMPETITIONS

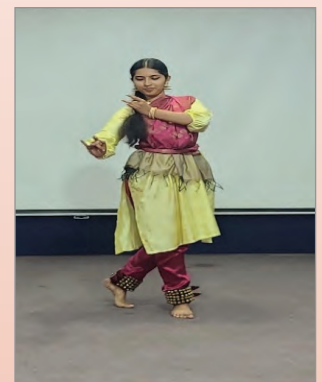
SWACHH BHARAT

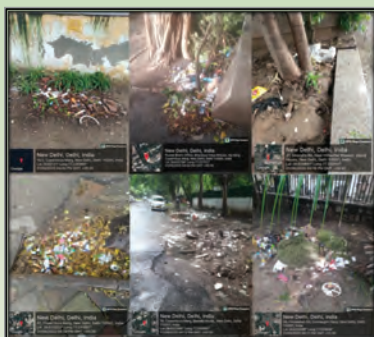

Educational Visit to Election Museum, Kashmiri Gate

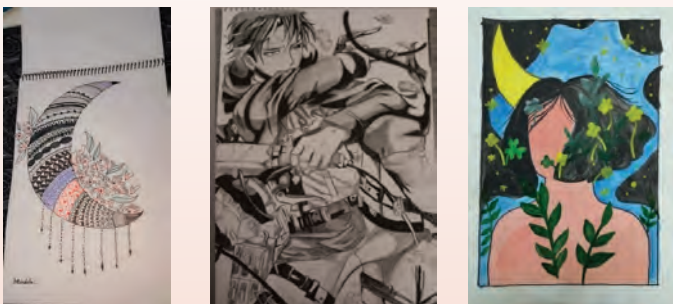
